ATTENTION EXHIBITORS!!

RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATE — New York State requires you to have proof of current rabies vaccination with you. Tags are not accepted. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases and have appropriate vaccinations.

UNENTERED DOGS, SHADE TENTS & X-PENS must be at least 20 feet back from the ring during show hours. Chairs will be allowed at ringside but no x-pens or tents (exception will be tent for judges ringside mentoring and show videographer with narrator).

FOOD VENDOR — There will be a food concession at the site offering a variety breakfast and lunch items.

BEST OF BREED – At the discretion of the Judge, up to three (3) Awards of Merit to be awarded to dogs or bitches entered in this class, except those winning BOB, BOS, BOW, WD or WB.

BRED BY EXHIBITOR (BBE) Class Eligibility (revised 09/02)

- All dogs entered in the Bred by Exhibitor Class must be **individually registered** with the AKC.
- The person handling the dog must be a breeder of record of the dog and an owner of record of the dog.
- To exhibit in this class, family members must be a breeder and owner of record.

NON-REGULAR (ADDITIONAL) CLASSES INVOLVING SINGLE DOG ENTRIES

VETERANS CLASS – Class for dogs and class for bitches 6 years of age or older. **Veterans Note:** 1st place winners of Veteran Dog & Veteran Bitch classes are eligible to compete for Best of Breed if undefeated in any other classes at this show. Neutered Dogs and Spayed Bitches may be entered.

NON-REGULAR CLASSES INVOLVING MULTIPLE DOG ENTRIES

As the judge's decision in the Non-Regular Classes involving Multiple Dog Entries is based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.

STUD DOG CLASS – For Stud Dog and two or more of their Get. It is not necessary that the Get be under the same ownership as that of the Stud Dog. The Stud Dog may be entered separately in one of the regular classes, or if a Champion of Record in Best of Breed Competition, but **MUST** be entered in the Stud Dog Class, the Get **MUST** be entered in one of the regular classes. The Stud Dog shall be considered as one entry and requires one entry fee, this being the regular fee plus the additional class fee if the Stud Dog is entered in another class. The Stud Dog must be shown in the ring with the Get. The class will be judged on the merits of the Get.

BROOD BITCH CLASS – Same as for the Stud Dog except substitute Brood Bitch for Stud Dog and Produce for Get.

BRACE CLASS – Two dogs of the same recognized breed or variety that are similar in appearance, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of two handlers. Both dogs competing in brace competition must have at least one common owner.

TEAM CLASS – Four dogs of the same recognized breed or variety that are similar in appearance, performing in unison, and presented by a maximum of four handlers. All dogs competing in team competition must have at least one common owner.

There will be no Junior Showmanship Classes.

MOVE-UP POLICY FOR THE SPECIALTY AND TRIALS — The Club will permit a move-up to the next level class in accordance with AKC regulations. The request for a move-up must be made in writing and presented to the Show Secretary or Trial Secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the specified event, show or trial. Move-up forms will be available at the Secretary's Table.

SWEEPSTAKES REQUIREMENTS & CLASSIFICATION

Dogs shown in Sweepstakes must be entered in one of the regular classes at the regular entry fee and on the regular entry form. Indicate your Sweepstakes Class with the age division in the space provided for "Additional Class." Champions of Record may not be entered. Professional Handlers may only show dogs owned by themselves.

The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches:
Junior - 6 mos & Under 9 mos, Junior - 9 mos & Under 12 mos,
Senior - 12 mos & Under 15 mos, Senior - 15 mos & Under 18 mos

Beginner Novice Exercises: Heel on Leash, Figure Eight (on Leash), Sit for Exam (on leash), Sit Stay, Recall. See AKC Obedience Regulations Chapter 6 for more details. *Beginner Novice A Class* — To be eligible for Beginner Novice A, a handler must own the dog entered, or be a member of the owner's household or immediate family, and may not have previously handled any dog that has earned any AKC Obedience title. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Beginner Novice A and Beginner Novice B at any trial. *Beginner Novice B Class* — The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class to earn a BN title. Owners may enter more than one dog in this class. No dog may be entered in both Beginner Novice A and Beginner Novice B at any trial.

GRADUATE NOVICE CLASS – The Graduate Novice Class is for dogs that have not been certified by a judge to have received a third qualifying score toward a CDX title prior to the closing of entries. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. *However, if a person has handled more than one dog in the first five exercises, that person must provide a handler for the additional dog in the same Long Down Group Exercise.* If eligible as defined in these *Regulations*, dogs entered in Graduate Novice may also be entered in any other obedience classes. The exercises, and order of judging (are as follows): Heel on Leash and Figure Eight (off leash), Drop on Recall, Dumbbell Recall, Recall Over High Jump, Recall Over Broad Jump, Long Down. See AKC Obedience Regulations Chapter 7 for more information.

GRADUATE OPEN CLASS – The Graduate Open class will be for dogs that have not won the Graduate Open (GO) title. The Graduate Open class is an optional class that may be offered by clubs at obedience events. The owner or any other person may handle multiple dogs in this class. If eligible as defined in these regulations, dogs entered in Graduate Open may also be entered in any other obedience class. The exercises, and order of judging are as follows: Signal Exercise, Scent Discrimination, Directed Retrieve, Moving Stand and Examination, Go Out, Directed Jumping. See AKC Obedience Regulations Chapter 8 for more information.

VERSATILITY CLASS – The Versatility class will be for all dogs and is an optional titling class that may be offered by clubs at obedience events. Owners may enter more than one dog. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person and may be entered in another class or classes. Six exercises will be performed: two each from the Novice, Open and Utility classes. There will be no group exercises. The exercises will be performed and judged as in the regular classes. For the purpose of this class, scent discrimination articles 1 and 2 will be considered as a single Utility exercise. See AKC Obedience Regulations Chapter 9 for more information.
